

DAY **1** Sunday, April 16
Embarkation in Miami

Embark MV *Adonia*. Meet your Road Scholar Group Leader in the ship's conference room at 5 p.m. for Orientation and Program Welcome. This very important briefing will cover our exclusive Road Scholar program of People to People activities, OFAC regulations and the cruise itinerary. Enjoy dinner on board.

DAY **2** Monday, April 17
At Sea En Route to Santiago de Cuba

As the ship sails toward Santiago de Cuba, meet with your Study Leader and enjoy a fascinating presentation on Cuba.

DAY **3** Tuesday, April 18
Meet the People of Santiago de Cuba

Arrival in Santiago de Cuba at 9 a.m. for full day of exploration. The city's colorful, sometimes turbulent history dates back to 1514, when it was founded by Spanish conquistadors. Walk through the Cemeterio Santa Ifigenia to examine impressive monuments to famous Cubans such as poet and national hero José Martí. Drive past the Castillo de San Pedro de la Roca, better known as El Morro, and stop in Revolution Square. Stroll through the historic center square. People-to-People Connection: Meet members of a community project that helps share the arts with kids in a needy neighborhood. After lunch at a local restaurant, explore the Diego Velázquez House and Museum, said to be the oldest standing house in Cuba. Return to the ship to depart for Cienfuegos.

DAY **4** Wednesday, April 19
Explore Cienfuegos, Music Ensemble

As the ship sails toward Cienfuegos, enjoy unique educational lectures. This afternoon, go ashore to meet your Cuban local expert and discover Cienfuegos, a UNESCO World Heritage city that offers outstanding architecture and is home to a large artistic community and one of the most beautiful theaters in Cuba. Begin with a visit to the local farmer market to engage vendors and understand the cost of living for locals. Continue to the main square of Cienfuegos on foot and visit the historic Tomas Terry theatre. People-to-People Connection: Meet with members of a talented music ensembles to enjoy a performance and learn about their daily lives. Then walk the main street of Cienfuegos to compare Ration and Cuban Peso stores.



DAY **5** Thursday, April 20
At Sea En Route to Havana

Meet with your Road Scholar Study Leader to discuss the history and culture of Cuba. After the lecture, your Study Leader will preview Friday's exploration of Havana. Following lunch on board, your afternoon is free to enjoy the ship's amenities and educational programming. Experience Cuban cuisine, be immersed in Cuba's cinematic history and enjoy Cuban music and entertainment on deck.

DAY **6** Friday, April 21
Dance Performance, Hemingway's Havana

Enjoy a performance by one of Cuba's preeminent dance companies, then engage in one-on-one discussions about their lives and profession. Next, coach to the outskirts of Havana to Finca La Vigía, the Ernest Hemingway Farm where the Nobel Prize-winning author lived with his third wife, Mary, for over 30 years. Walk the grounds to see his private writing studio, swimming pool and beloved fishing boat, Pilar — featured in his novel "Islands in the Stream." Continue to the fishing village of Cojimar made famous by Hemingway. After lunch, return to Old Havana to walk through two of Old Havana's main squares. Return to the ship on foot.

DAY **7** Saturday, April 22
Havana

Continue to explore on foot in Old Havana and enjoy a People-to-People Connection at the Plaza de Armas Book Market. Havana's oldest square — dating to the 16th century — is the site of a famous second-hand book market. Meet some of the sellers for a firsthand glimpse into this fascinating aspect of life in Cuba. Later, meet organizers at Arte Corte, a community project that also includes a vocational program for hairdressers and barbers. Next, enjoy an overview of Havana, coaching past the Capitolio, the Malecón — Havana's seafront promenade — the U.S. Embassy, La Rampa and Havana University. After lunch, take in the view from outside of San Carlos de la Cabana, known simply as "La Cabana." This fortress protected the mouth of the Havana harbor in its day. Return to the ship and continue to enjoy educational programming and amenities on board as you sail toward Miami. Tonight, enjoy a Farewell Dinner on the ship.

DAY **7** Sunday, April 23
Program Concludes
